ABOUT THE AUTHOR



Mark Twain, whose real name was Samuel Langhorne Clemens, was born on November 30th 1835. Not only was he a writer, he was also a publisher[•], teacher, and businessman. He was born just after the appearance of Halley's comet[•]. When he was older, he said that he would die when the comet returned. Twain lived most of his young life in Hannibal, Missouri, a

town on the Mississippi river. It was when he was living there that he got the idea for two of his most famous novels, *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer* and *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn.* In 1870, he married Olivia Langdon, and they had three daughters: Susy, Clara and Jean. He wrote *A Connecticut Yankee in King Arthur's Court* in 1889. Twain made a lot of money from his writing but he also lost a lot of money in bad investments. He spent \$300,000 (the same as \$6 million today) on the Paige Typesetting Machine which never made a profit[•]. When his daughter Susy died in 1896, Twain suffered from depression[•]. The death of his wife Olivia, and his other daughter, Jean, added greatly to his suffering. He died of a heart attack on April 21st 1910, the day after Halley's comet reappeared. His prediction[•], made all those years ago, was correct.

- comet: star with a bright tail
- depression: illness which makes people very sad and tired
- **investments:** money used to try and make more money
- prediction: guess about the future
- **profit:** money made after selling something
- **publisher:** someone whose job is to print books



Some people think that Camelot is a mythical place, the capital of King Arthur's kingdom in stories and movies but not real. Others believe that Camelot was a real place somewhere in Great Britain. The truth is that no one is very sure.



Born in Cornwall?

In 1136, **Geoffrey of Monmouth** wrote *The History of the Kings of Britain*. He said King Arthur was born at Tintagel Castle in **Cornwall**, but he named **Caerleon in Wales** as his court.

The first Camelot

In a poem by a Frenchman called **Chrétien de Troyes** from the 1170s, Camelot is written down for the first time and is also said to be near **Caerleon in Wales**.

Welsh folk stories

The Mabinogion are folk stories about King Arthur and his knights. They are taken from early medieval Welsh manuscripts•. They don't mention Camelot but do say that King Arthur lived in Cornwall. Folk stories were passed on by word of mouth• long before they were written down.

FACTFILE

The Winchester theory

Thomas Malory wrote that Camelot was in Winchester, England in his famous 1485 book *Le Morte* D'Arthur.

The final

In 1542 John Leland, an early antiquarian named Cadbury Castle in Somerset, England as Camelot. This hill fort• is near a town called 'West Camel', which is believed to be the location of Arthur's final battle.



What's in a name?

Some experts believe that King Arthur's name comes from the Roman name Astorius, which means falcon•. While others believe it is Celtic in origin - coming from the word Art-rig meaning Bear King. Do you know what your name means?

- antiquarian: someone who collects or studies old and valuable objects
- falcon: large bird that hunts small animals
- hill fort: fort or castle built on hill, or the remains of one
- manuscripts: first handwritten copies of a book
- **theory:** (here) idea explaining historical events
- word of mouth: information passed on orally (by voice)

It was 1889 and I was on a guided tour of Warwick Castle when I first met him. He was a strange man but he was friendly and he talked a lot. He was called Hank Morgan and he knew a lot about English history. He talked about Sir Bedivere, Sir Bors De Ganis, Sir Launcelot of the Lake, Sir Galahad, and all the other Knights of the Round Table as if they were old friends and neighbors. Then he turned to me and asked:

'Do you know about time travel?'

I said I knew nothing about such things, but he was not listening to me. Just then, our group stopped in front of a suit of armor[•] and the guide started speaking.

'This suit of armor is from the sixth century, the time of King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table. Many people believe the armor belonged to Sir Sagramour le Desirous. Do you see anything strange about it?' he asked. 'Look carefully.'

'There's a bullet[•] hole in it!' someone in our group said. How S did it get there?'

The guide smiled. 'No one knows because guns[•] are a modern invention[•].'

When Morgan heard this, he laughed and whispered. 'I know. I did it myself.'

Surprised, I turned to ask him what he meant.

But I was too late: he was gone.

That night, I went back to my hotel and sat by the fire in my room. Outside, it was raining and a strong wind was blowing. But inside, I was warm and comfortable. I forgot about Morgan and I began reading a book. Page after page I read and when I looked at the time, it was after midnight. I put down my book when there was a sudden knock[•] at the door and Morgan came in.

I gave him a pipe[•] and a chair and made him welcome. At first, he sat silently; then he told me his story...

'I am American,' he said. 'I was born in Hartford in the state of Connecticut. I am what they call a "Yankee". My father was a blacksmith and my uncle a horse doctor but I worked in a weapons factory[•]. I learned to make guns, revolvers[•], cannons[•], all kinds of machines. I am good at inventing things, so I quickly became the manager at my work.

'I was an important man. I had a thousand men working for me. But I had to argue a lot. And I usually won. Then one day, I met my match[•]. I was arguing with a man at work. He was big and strong, and the other men called him "Hercules". We started to fight, and he hit me on the head with a metal bar. I heard my head crack. The world went black and I didn't know anything at all... at least for a while.

- **factory:** building where large amounts of things are made
- **knock:** sound made when one hits something
- met my match: met someone as good as, or better than me
- pipe: Va • revolvers: Val

'When I woke up, I was sitting under an old oak[•] tree, on the grass. I was in the middle of the countryside and I was not alone. There was a man on a horse, looking down at me. He was wearing a suit of armor with a helmet[•] and he had a sword[•] and shield[•]. He spoke to me through his helmet and I didn't understand him. He looked so strange that I started laughing.

'This made the man very angry and he ran at me with his sword. But I was too quick and I climbed the tree and got out of his way. But now there was nowhere to run, and we came to an agreement[•]. He wanted to take me prisoner. I agreed to go with him, and he agreed not to harm[•] me. So we set off together. He was riding and I was walking by his horse. We walked for about an hour.
